- The Don Bosco Children Fund of Cambodia team members met at Don Bosco Kep between 11 to 13 of July, 2023 to evaluate, plan and empower the staff to continue supporting Cambodian children in disadvantage through the networks of national and international benefactors. We are working hand in hand with the Royal Government of Cambodia in supporting the poor students through various educational programs such as technical training, general education Kindergarten till high school, children fund, oratory and other complementary programs as a means of breaking the cycle of poverty and developing the society.

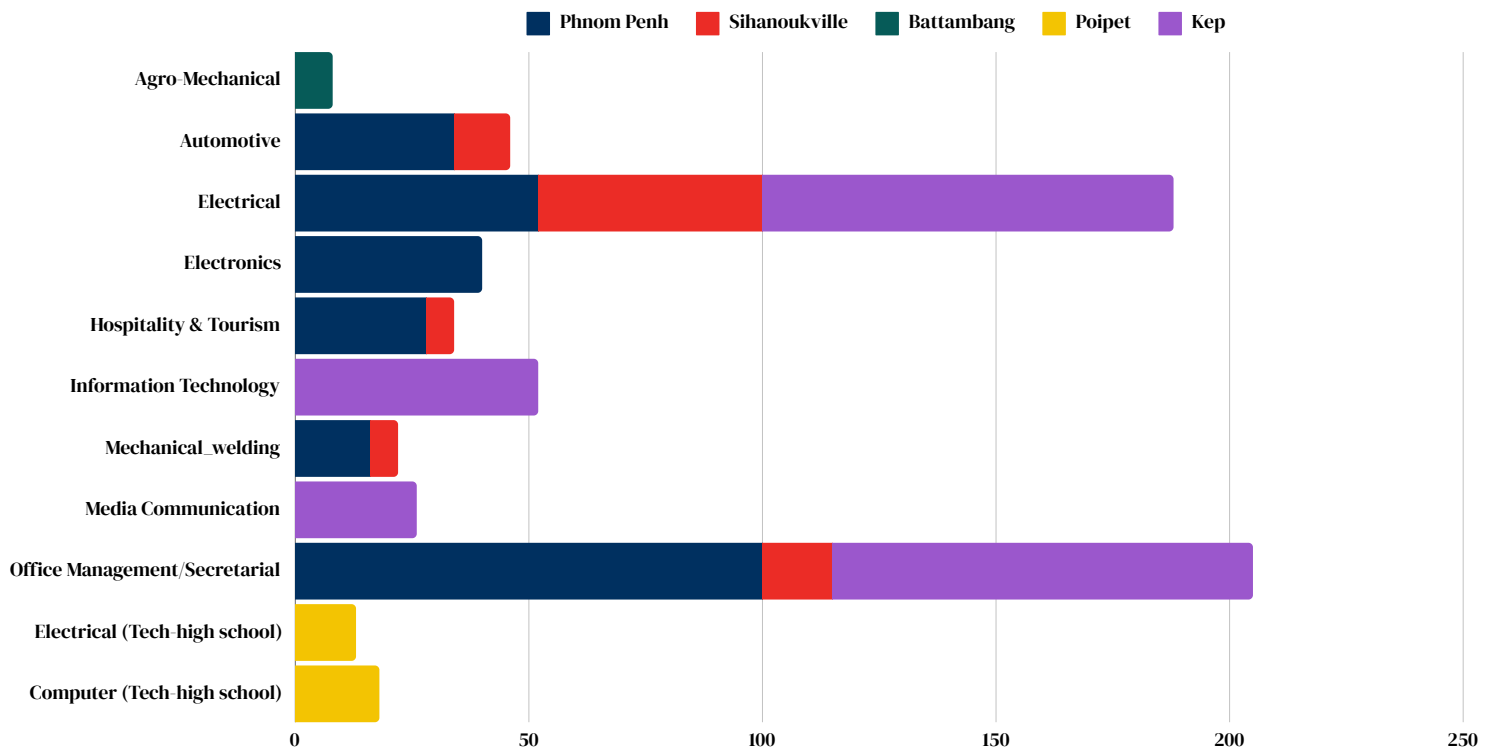
TVET GRADUATES

At least around **652** of TVET students graduated from various skills in the different locations of the Don Bosco Schools. Mainly we offer a 2-year training scholarship program (higher technical diploma or equivalent to associate degree) and also other shorter programs like C1, C2 or C3 for those who have not reached grade 12. These are statistics of TVET graduates in 2023 classified by skills that is from the following schools which is under the care of the Don Bosco Foundation of Cambodia International (DBFC-OI):

- DON BOSCO TECHNICAL SCHOOL PHNOM PENH
- DON BOSCO VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER TUOL KORK
- DON BOSCO TECHNICAL & HOTEL SCHOOL SIHANOUK PROVINCE
- DON BOSCO ARGO-VOCATIONAL TRAINING CENTER BATTAMBANG
- DON BOSCO TECHNICAL SCHOOL KEP PROVINCE



Among 652 who graduated in 2023, there are 285 female. Most of the female graduated from Secretarial/ Office management, hospitality & tourism, and IT skill. As by location: Phnom Penh: 270 (f:147), Sihanoukville: 87 (f:18), Battambang: 8 (f:0), Poipet: 31 (f:10), and Kep: 256 (f:110). Here is the display by skill in stacked row chart below.



SPECIAL PROJECTS OR ACTIVITIES

Prison vocational training Project

At least 13 inmates received the short course training in 2023. And 32 trainees are currently under go. Besides that we are preparing classroom for teaching children who live with their mother as well.



Farm production Expansion

This self-sustaining projects help to enhance self-generate incomes activities in 5 schools with the support of Wilde Ganzen & SSCR. Which help to produce food to feed especially the boarder student around 400 in 2023.



Environment & social awareness

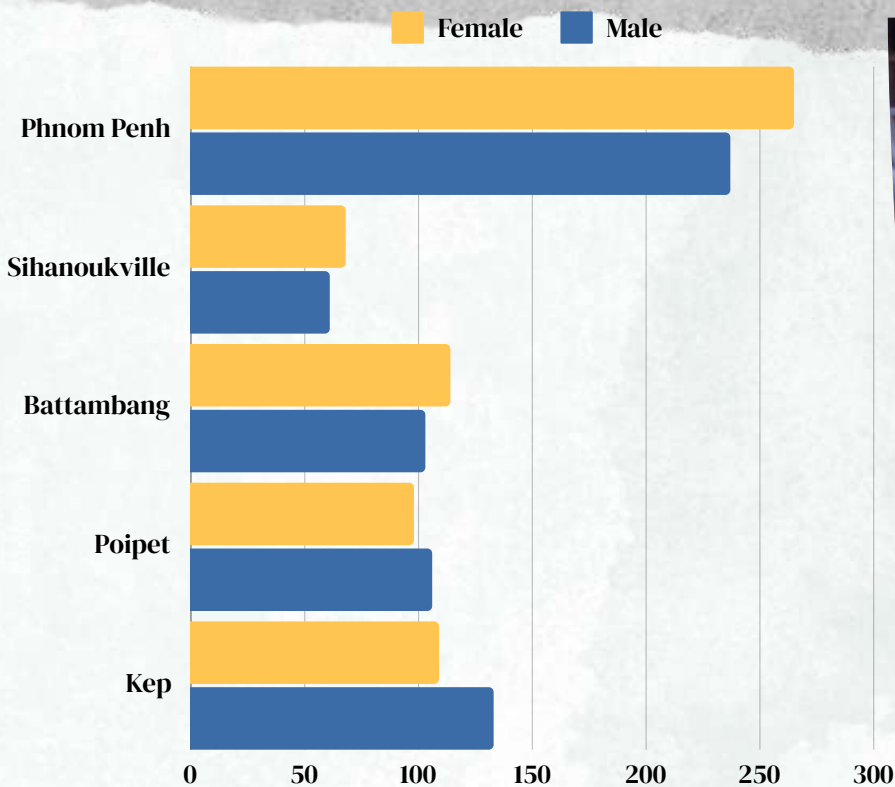


So far in 2023, we support around 526 (f: 303) of poorer students boarding in 7 schools or locations.

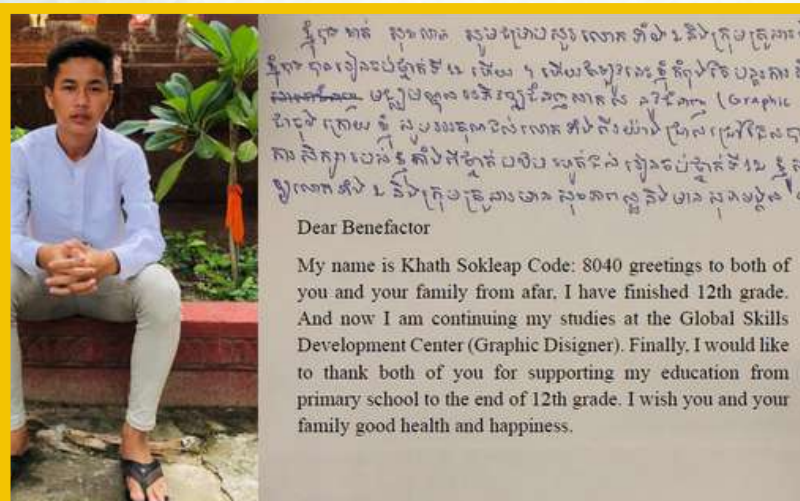
Children Fund (Who finished high school)



About 1294 children, mostly in rural areas, are receiving financial assistance to go to school. This is crucial to encouraging children and parents to continue their studies till grade 12 for them to have a stronger foundation for higher education. Furthermore, this program contributes to the prevention of child labor and other forms of abuse. SIPT (Supervised In-Plant Training)

We partner with more than 200 companies both in formal and non-formal working relationships in the form of "Corporate Social Responsibility" (CSR). 100% of our TVET students got their place for a 3-month internship. 100% of our students got employment after finishing the training.



PURPOSE/OBJECTIVE OF SIPT

- Give the SIPT trainees, who had undergone the In-Campus Training an opportunity to:
 - Apply and further enhance their skills and gain more experience in the field of technology in view of job application after SIPT.
 - Develop the right attitudes and values towards work, in dealing with co-workers and people in authority, and
 - Integrate faith and life in daily working situations, thus becoming a good, honest, and productive citizen.
- Further, develop the TRAINING INSTITUTION's Program by working hand-in-hand with the INDUSTRY PARTNER in the curriculum development and program evaluation.
- Strengthen the cooperation between the TRAINING INSTITUTION and INDUSTRY PARTNER's need for skilled workers.
- Give the INDUSTRY PARTNER an avenue to exercise corporate social responsibility in community development and poverty alleviation of the marginalized/underprivileged youth through technical skills training.



Based on a recent survey (November 2023), one of the schools showed that both company partners and students feel happy for having this program and linking them together. As this survey also showed, they have decent jobs with decent salaries. **43.3%** receive salaries higher than **\$300**; **27.5%** receive salaries between **\$251-\$300**, and another **27.5%** receive salaries between **\$201 and \$250**. This means that **98.3% get reasonable pay after 3-months of internship**. From there, graduates shall receive a gradual increase in salary depending on their performance.

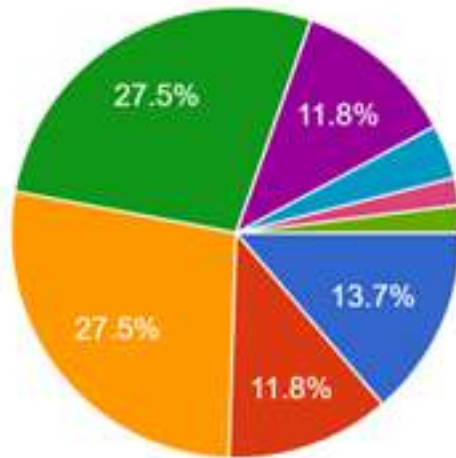

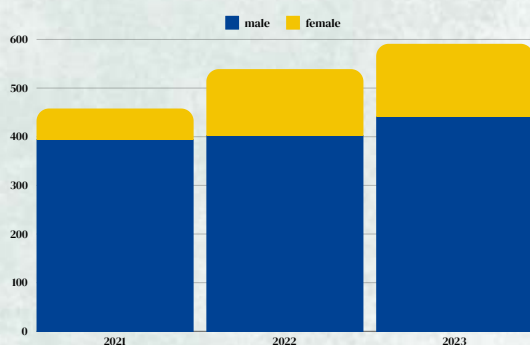

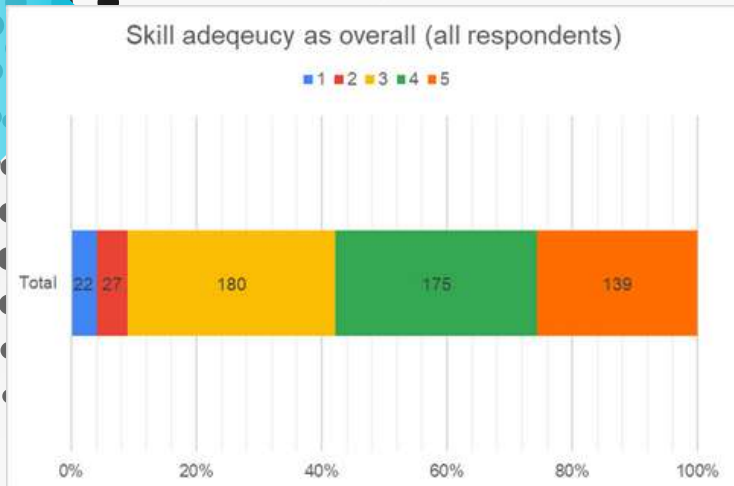

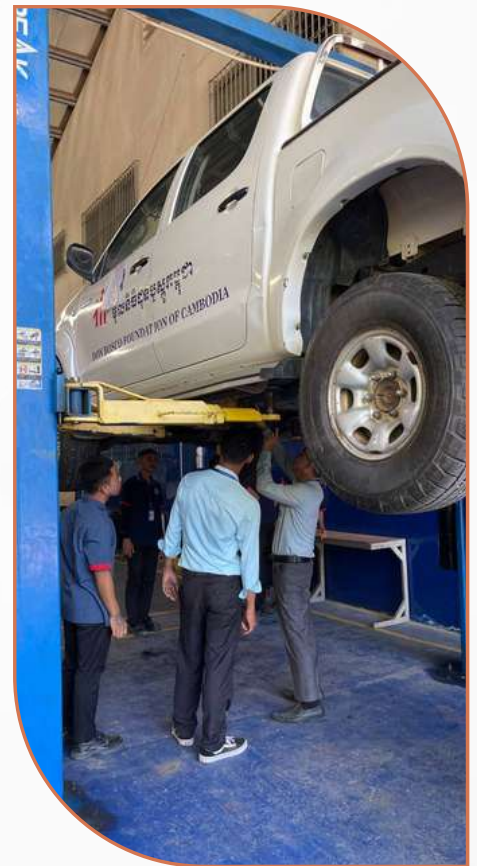
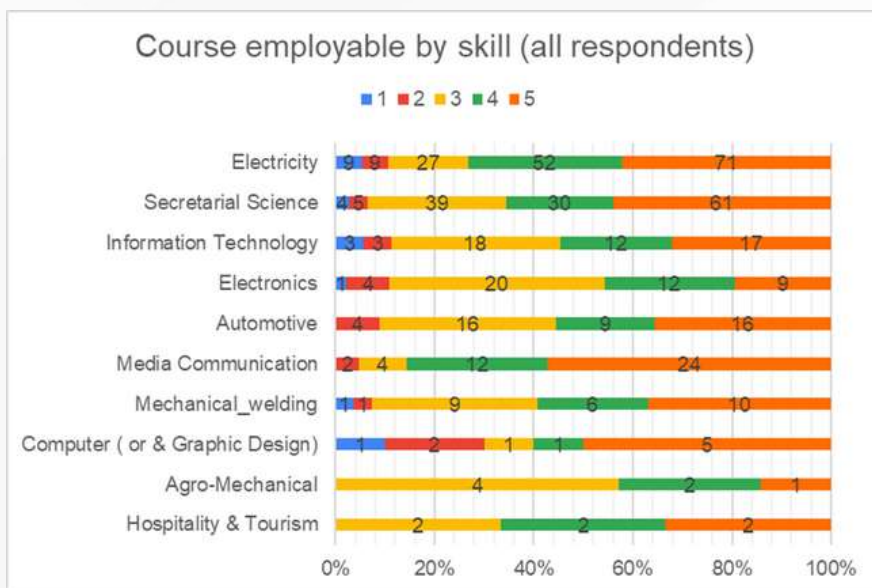

Do you feel competent/confident with your skill? 1 Strongly disagree, 5 Strongly agree

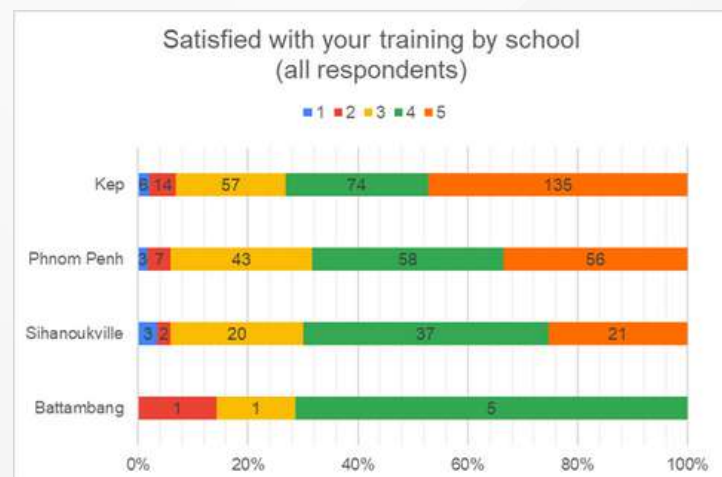

Are you happy/satisfied with your course and training? 1 Not satisfied 5 Very satisfied

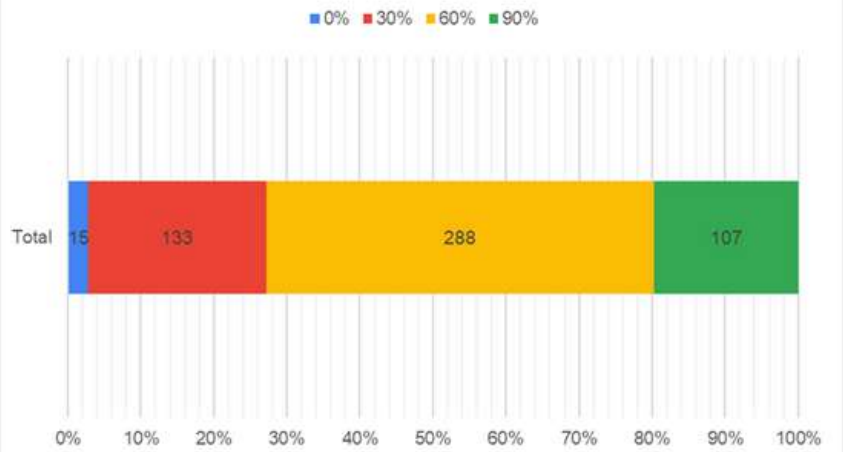


How much of your skill is applied to your job?

- 90% I use my skills in this job most of the time



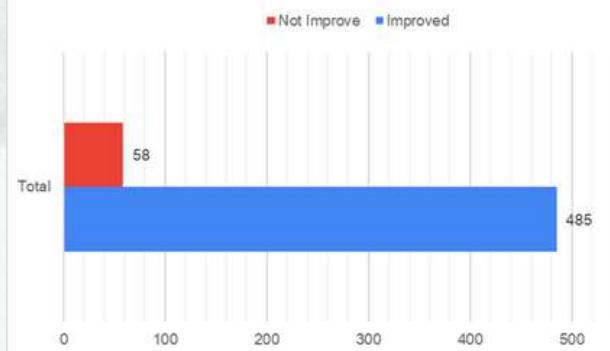
Percentage skill applied in their job (all respondents)



A large percentage of the skills they learned from the school are relevant and can be applied in their workplaces for most of the respondents.

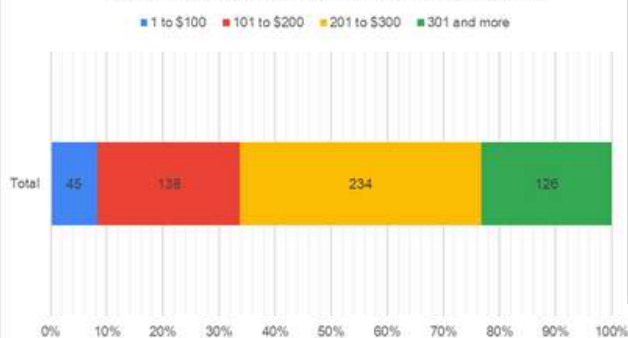

Has your living standard improved? overall (all respondents)



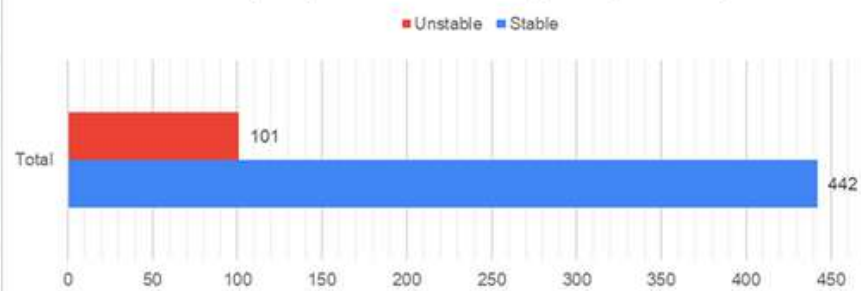
Monthly income 43.10% between 201 to 300 usd while 23.20%, 300 usd plus. Thus 66.30 % has more than minimum wage of government.

Overall monthly income in USD (all respondents)



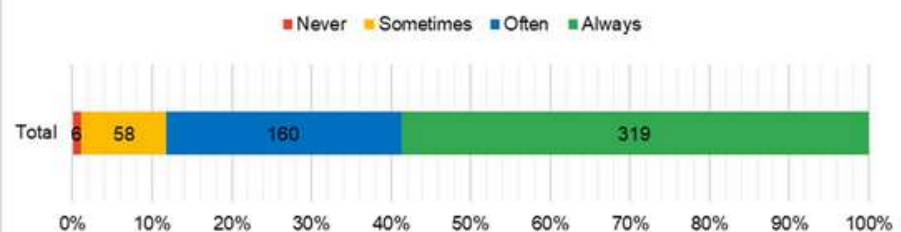

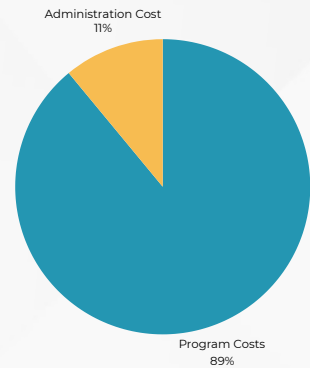
Expenses

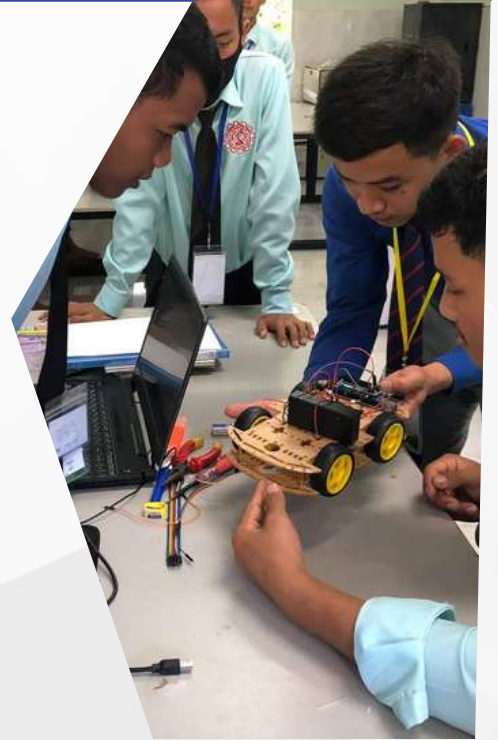
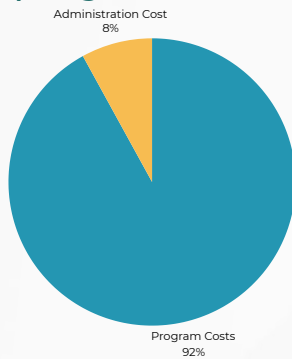
- 4,437 students (local: \$ 1,553,878.23) or in average \$350 per student in 2023.
